The Lord sent us Brother Liu-jia and his wife in November. Brother Liu is a Chinese man grown in a three generation Christian home in China. His parents are very active in a Chinese house church. Mrs. Liu is a Korean Chinese who also has grown in a three generation Christian family in Northwestern China. Her grandmother was one of the first disciples of the Missionary Malcom Fenwick, the first Baptist Missionary from Canada in 1890'. History tells that Mr. Fenwick was one of the first Fundamentalists who had been involved in Niagara Bible Conference and the Fundamentalist movement. He has planted many churches in both S. and N. Korea and had translated the Bible into Korean language also. Mrs. Liu's father is pastoring a house church in Korean community in China. We are looking forward to meeting him sometime in the future.




